

Minutes of the City Council meeting held March 21, 1985 at 4:34 p.m. in the City Hall of Bountiful, Utah.

Mayor Stahle called the meeting to order and welcomed those in attendance.

MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL MADE AWARE OF SPECIAL WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES

Mrs. Colleen Sessions presented information on the Special Winter Olympic Games to be held at Park City, March 25-29. Handicapped participants for these Games will come from all over the world. Many celebrities will also be there. Mrs. Sessions invited Bountiful City officials to attend the Games and be "huggers" to help provide spirit for the participants. She distributed free tickets for the closing ceremony of the Games to the Mayor, Council Members, and other City officials present who expressed an interest in attending. Before leaving, she also thanked City officials for use of the City's Ice Arena during these special events.

BID FOR CREEK LINING PROJECT ON STONE CREEK AWARDED TO J & R CONSTRUCTION

Jack Balling made a presentation concerning a creek lining project on which bids were opened today. The project is located on Stone Creek near Hannah Holbrook School (east from our present lining to Davis Boulevard). Don Johnson, a property owner along Stone Creek in that area, has suggested that the City construct a sediment basin in connection with this project because of the large amount of damage sustained by the concrete lining in that area because of heavy runoff and large rocks coming down. Mr. Balling said there was a great deal of damage done to the lining due to the reasons stated by Mr. Johnson. Mr. Balling also stated that another contributing factor in the damage done was the fact that the property owners along that section of the creek could not agree to let the City proceed, and by the time the project was completed, the spring runoff was beginning, not allowing much time for the concrete to really cure properly. Mr. Balling said that sediment basins are nice, but they are a large-cost maintenance item, which continues year after year. The Mayor and Council agreed, and decided that we not consider a sediment basin in that area. Concrete creek lining will have to be replaced periodically,

but it would be cheaper in the long run than maintaining a sediment basin. Tom Hardy pointed out that as time passes, the amount of debris coming down the creek will stabilize and the lining will last longer.

The bids for this project were then reviewed. They are as follows:

Mr. Balling recommended that the low bidder, J. & R. Construction, be awarded the bid to do the work on those properties where the owners will allow it. Also, that J. & R. be asked to do an area on Barton Creek (east from 500 South to 750 East) at the same unit price that they bid on this job. A motion to this effect was made by Councilman J. Dean Hill, seconded by Councilman Richard G. Sharp, and carried unanimously.

As there was no further business, the meeting adjourned at 5:15 p.m.
