Official Notice of this meeting had been given by posting a written notice of same and an Agenda at the City Hall and providing copies to the following newspapers of general circulation: Davis County Clipper, Deseret News, and Salt Lake Tribune.

Mayor Pro-tem Shafter called the meeting to order, following which Mr. Hardy led the pledge of allegiance to the flag. The invocation was given by Mr. Balling.

Minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held September 4, 1991 were presented and unanimously approved as written on a motion made by Councilman Foy and seconded by Councilwoman Holt.

EXPENSES AND EXPENDITURES APPROVED FOR TWO AUGUST PERIODS

Mr. Jenson presented the Expenditure and Expense Report for the Period August 29-31, 1991 in the amount of \$405,434.36; and the Summary for August totaling \$2,533,063.65. He pointed out minor corrections to the annotation, following which the expenditures were unanimously approved on a motion made by Councilwoman Coon and seconded by Councilman Foy.

Councilwoman Coon asked if the Council is no longer reviewing the Newsletter prior to its distribution (inasmuch as the most recent issue was mailed without Council review). Mr. Hardy stated that this was an oversight on his part and the Newsletter will be previewed by the Council in the future.

COUNCIL ADOPTS ORD. NO. 91-7 RE: PARKING ON PARK STRIPS

Mr. Forbes explained that the existing traffic code makes it unlawful to park on the sidewalk; however there is no direct provision which makes it illegal to park on the park strip. Several citizens have complained about cars being parked across the park strip, forcing pedestrians to walk in the street. Therefore, an ordinance has been prepared which makes it unlawful to park motor vehicles and other objects on park strips. He reviewed Ord. No. 91-7 entitled "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE XIII, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 103 OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF BOUNTIFUL, UTAH 1965 AS AMENDED BY MAKING IT

UNLAWFUL TO PARK MOTOR VEHICLES AND OTHER OBJECTS ON PARKING STRIPS". Following discussion, Councilwoman Holt made a motion to adopt Ord. No. 91-7, with approval for the Mayor to sign. Mayor Pro Tempore Shafter seconded the motion and voting was unanimous.

.COUNCIL CONSIDERS AMENDMENT TO HORSE-DRAWN CARRIAGE ORDINANCE

Mr. Forbes reviewed that an ordinance regarding the horse-drawn carriage business in Bountiful was adopted in January, 1990. This type of business has recently become operational in the city and it has become apparent that there is a conflict between the hours when patrons wish to use the carriage and the curfew ordinance for minors.

Renee Ramage, proprietor of the carriage business, explained that the existing ordinance provides that any rides which are given after 11 p.m. must be approved by the Chief of Police. Inasmuch as the curfew for minors is later than that (midnight on school nights and 1 a.m. when school is not in session) and approval from the Police is required on a regular basis, Ms. Ramage asked if the hours of the carriage business could be made consistent with the curfew. (She noted that student dances are not over until 11:30 p.m. which creates a conflict with her business unless special approval is granted). Following discussion, Councilwoman Coon made the motion that the staff be directed to prepare an ordinance to provide that operating hours be extended to coincide with curfew. Councilman Foy seconded the motion. Councilwoman Holt requested that the Council be apprised if any problems come up regarding the carriage business. Voting on the motion was unanimous.

MISCELLANEOUS

Mayor Pro-tem Shafter invited those in attendance to visit the Open House being sponsored by the Power Department Thursday evening from 5 to 7 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 7:33 p.m. on a motion made by Councilwoman Holt and seconded by Councilwoman Coon.
