Official Notice of this meeting had been given by posting a written notice of same and an Agenda at the City Hall and providing copies to the following newspapers of general circulation: Davis County Clipper, Deseret News, and Salt Lake Tribune.

Mayor Linnell called the meeting to order and welcomed those in attendance. He explained that Councilman Gramoll was unable to attend this swearing-in ceremony and will be attending the regular meeting Wednesday evening (January 8th) and a Resolution of Appreciation will be presented to him at that time.

He then recognized incumbent Councilman Shafter and Councilwoman Holt, and Councilman-elect John Cushing and requested that Mr. Jenson perform the official swearing in ceremony. The council candidates repeated the Oath of Office after Mr. Jenson following which Mayor Linnell expressed appreciation for the high caliber of people who have been elected to serve and for their willingness to seek office.

Councilwoman Holt expressed appreciation for the opportunity to be of service and she recognized the excellent department heads, staff, and hard-working employees of the City. She acknowledged Bountiful as a good place to live and invited input from the citizens so that "we can serve them the way they want to be served".

Councilman Shafter stated that of all municipalities he has had opportunity to observe, Bountiful is the best place to live. He recognized the great leadership which the City has had in the past, mentioned the sound financial position of the City, and praised the staff for their efforts on behalf of the City. He expressed gratitude for the opportunity of serving a third term on the Council and the hope that he will leave a positive impact on the City.

Councilman Cushing said he was pleased to have the opportunity of serving. He said that his recent experience of participating with the Council has been an eye-opener and he

acknowledged the serious responsibility which comes with this honor of serving. He congratulated the incumbents on their re-election and said that he looks forward to working with long-time friends. He noted that his mother worked for the city for 22 years, serving a good portion of that time as treasurer. He also complimented the staff on the remarkable day-to-day job which they are doing. He said that he anticipates the Council will have many testing challenges and expressed excitement for the opportunity to try to resolve them in an equitable and fair manner.

Mayor Linnell closed the meeting by congratulating the newly elected councilpersons and stating that he was looking forward to working with them.
